

# Development of support for curriculum and assessment design within Curriculum

It is important to understand this is a bespoke package of support specifically written to support Curriculum for Wales. Each cohort will contain two members of staff (a senior leader and classroom practitioner) to develop collaboration within schools. The programme will then enable collaboration across schools, prioritising clusters to participate together where possible. As each cohort moves forward, groups of curriculum and assessment design coaches will be available to support ongoing school improvement priorities.

Schools can still register and will automatically be enrolled on the next available 5 sessions, taking place between 14:30 and 17:00 in January and February 2025.

Throughout this time, schools will have access to the Curriculum for Wales Institute, where they can build their curriculum within this platform to explore curriculum design and reflect on their own understanding of the Curriculum for Wales Framework.

There will be an expectation for on-line collaboration throughout the asynchronous units, as well as sharing progress and reflections during a further 5 sessions between 14:30 and 17:00 in June and July 2025.

This project is being fully funded by Welsh Government via local authority payments with participating schools receiving funding of £150 per session per person.

We will be supported by international curriculum design expert Allison Zmuda. Further information can be found on the Allison Zmunda website. Being US-based means all sessions will be held between 14:30 and 17:00. Schools will also have the opportunity to test their thinking with curriculum design experts and network with other schools across Wales.
